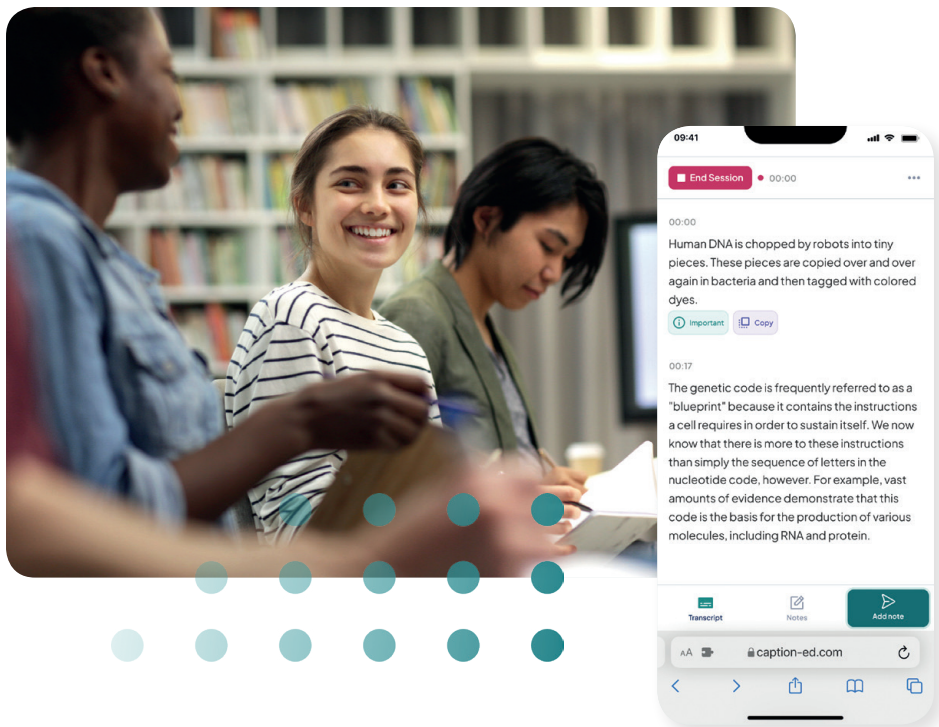
# Two versions of Caption.Ed are available within the Disabled Students' Allowance: Caption.Ed Pro and Caption.Ed Notes.

This guide aims to clarify the difference between the two products so that you feel confident in recommending the most appropriate version of Caption.Ed to students.

## What's the difference between Caption.Ed Pro and Caption.Ed Notes?

Caption.Ed is captioning and note-taking software which helps students become independent in their learning. Within the DSA, there is a subtle difference between Caption.Ed Pro and Caption.Ed Notes which impacts who you can recommend the software to, and what features they can access. The chart below provides a simple breakdown as to the difference between the two products.
